Water gets the 'All Clear' from Camelbak UV purifier

Camelbak gets it right with the All Clear UV water purifier water.

The technology to purify water with UV rays has been evolving over the past 10 years. Early on-the-go purifiers consisted of a UV wand, carried separately, which was inserted into water and stirred around to kill bacteria, viruses and protozoan cysts.

Camelbak has incorporated the water purifier into the water bottle. By placing the UV lamp into the lid of a .75 liter water bottle, campers hikers, and world travelers will always have a water purifier on hand if there is any uncertainty about the water.

For anyone considering a prolonged outing such as a hike on the Appalachian Trail, a water purifier is must-carry equipment.

Usage is simple. Just fill the bottle, turn it on and agitate for 60 seconds. An LCD display confirms purification.

The Camelbak All Clear also includes a usb charging port so carrying expensive spare batteries is not an issue.

For a back-up bottle to hold purified water, try the Camelbak Eddy water bottle featuring a flip and sip bite-valve to prevent spilling.
